EUEI....

Was launched at World Summit for Sustainable Development (WSSD) 2002 in as a joint commitment by EU Member States and the Commission

Is a political framework for dialogue and actions, inside the EU and with Development Partners

Has created an active energy dialogue between the EU and Africa, leading to a number of specific results, including the Infrastructure Partnership

Has been a driving force for integration of energy in EU development assistance

Has created different financial instruments, such as the Energy Facility, EUEI-PDF and COOPENER

ACP-EC Energy Facility



- Call for proposals for app €198 M
- Deadline 6 October 2006
- 307 proposals were received. Some had to be excluded for formal reasons. Remaining proposals cover 3 times the amount available
- Two-step evaluation:
 - Concept notes
 - Full proposals (detailed evaluation)
- 93% of the funds were requested for access projects, 6% for management and governance, 1% for regional cooperation
- Regional distribution: East Africa € 204 M, West Africa € 172 M, Caribbean and the Pacific each € 25 M
- Detailed evaluation should finish March 2007, first contracts should be signed July 2007



ACP-EC Energy Facility

€10 M outside the call for proposals is being programmed for support to:

West Africa Power Pool (WAPP)

South Africa Power Pool (SAPP)

Central Africa Power Pool (CAPP)

East Africa Power Pool (EAPP)

EUEI Partnership and Dialogue Facility

EUEI-PDF

Established by 6 EU Member States as an instrument under the EUEI. Supports mainly 'upstream' activities, e.g. policy and strategy development. Total budget app € 4 M

Regional organisations in Africa:

Projects completed with CEMAC, ECOWAS, ECA

Countries in Africa:

Projects completed: Zambia, Gambia, Mali, Tanzania, Sierra Leone

Projects under implementation or preparation: Senegal, Rwanda, Malawi, Madagascar, Lesotho, Botswana, Swaziland, Uganda, Cameroon, Ethiopia, Liberia.

Also a few projects in Central and South America



COOPENER

Focus on capacity building in energy efficiency and renewable energy. Significant participation of local partners required. Total budget € 17 M, which is doubled via co-funding

First Call 2003 – Sub-Saharan Africa: 14 projects started January / April 2005

Second Call 2004 – Sub-Saharan Africa & Latin America: 11 projects started January 2006

Third & Final Call 2005 - Sub-Saharan Africa & Latin America & Asia: 14 projects starting January 2007



COOPENER

Some examples: Sub-saharan Africa, 3rd call

TREESPA: Energy efficiency purchasing schemes for local SMEs

SURE-AFRICA (Cape Verde, Mozambique, and Angola): Energy efficiency in urban areas

PACEEA (Burundi, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Mozambique, Rwanda, Sudan, Swaziland, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia): Cogeneration and micro-hydro in agro-industries

CARAMCODEC: Efficient use of forest supplies and charcoal in Madagascar

E-MINDSET (Malawi, Mozambique, Zambia and Zimbabwe): Integration of MDGs into local energy planning



Thematic Programme

- Thematic Programme for Environment and Sustainable Management of Natural Resources including Energy (ENTRP)
- Part of the Development Cooperation Instrument (DCI) 2007-2013 (not included in the European Development Fund)
- Expected to be finally approved early 2007
- Implementation strategy under development for the first 4 years



Thematic Programme

Sub programme V: Support for sustainable energy options in partner countries and regions

'COOPENER II'

- Develop institutional support and technical assistance
- Creating a favourable legislative and policy framework to attract new business and investors in RE and EE
- Enhance role of energy as a means of income generation for the poor
- Encourage regional cooperation

Contributions to global initiatives, e.g. gas flaring

New financing mechanism: GEEREF
