The main drivers

Energy access

Energy-linked poverty :
Insufficient access to electricity services
Unsustainable use of traditional fuels

Climate change

- Deforestation
- Adaptation and Mitigation
- Impacts on energy infrastructure

Energy prices and security

- Impact on productivity
- High price for fossil fuels

Key elements of the Partnership (1)



- Strengthen the **Africa-EU dialogue** on energy security and access to energy
- Promote **transparency**
- **Better management** of energy resources, **development-oriented use of oil and gas revenues**

Key elements of the Partnership (2)



- Promote **enabling frameworks and technical capacities**
- Mainstream **climate change** in energy development cooperation
- Scale up **investment in energy infrastructure**, including promotion of renewable energy solutions & energy efficiency

Instruments supporting Efficiency



- **EDF and ENPI**
- The **Infrastructure Trust Fund** – connecting Africa
- The **ACP-EC Energy Facility** – reach-out at local level and regional integration
- **ENRTP** Thematic Programme – flexible financing for energy
- **GEEREF** – mobilising commercial investments

- EU-Africa Summit 8-9 December:
Adoption of Joint Strategy and Action Plan
- Implement Action Plan 2008-2009
- Mobilise additional resources and actions via an integrated framework
- Look beyond 2009
- Monitoring and reporting
