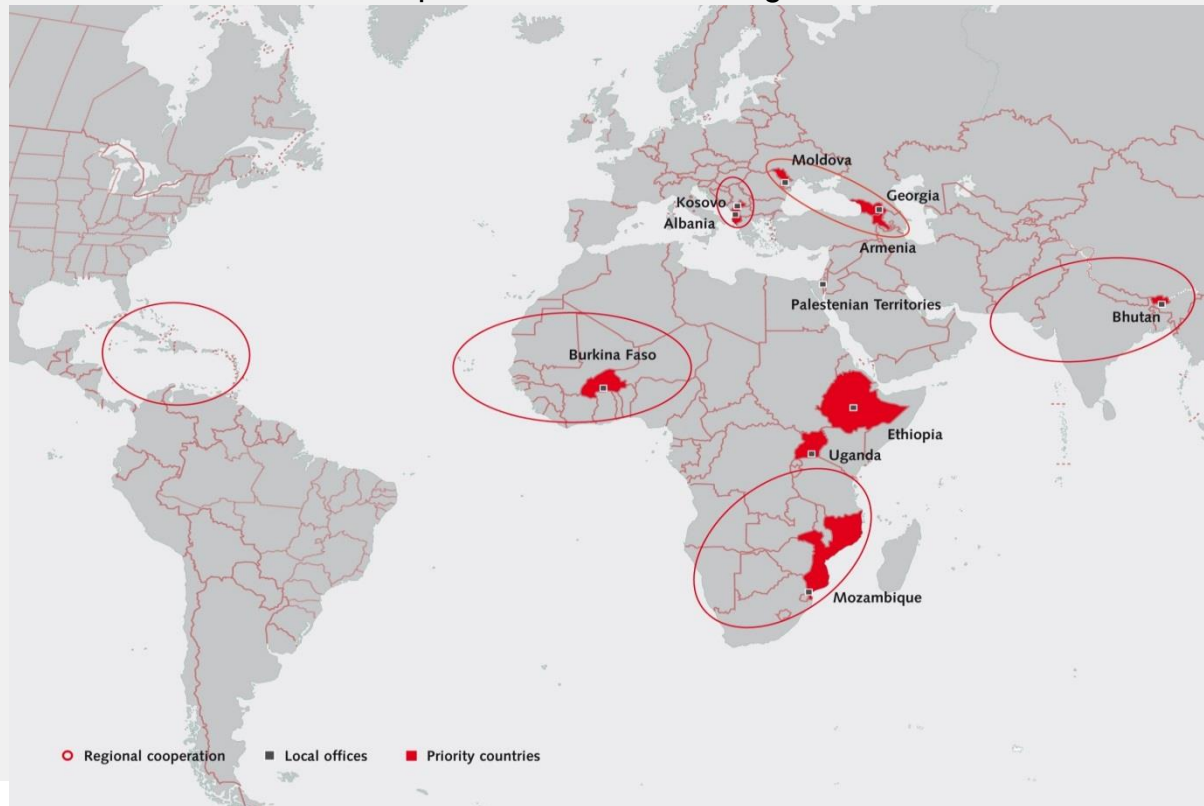

- West Africa: Burkina Faso
- Southern Africa: Mozambique
- Ethiopia, Uganda
- Himalayas/Hindu Kush: Bhutan
- Danube Region/Western Balkans: Kosovo, Albania
- Black Sea region/South Caucasus: Moldova, Armenia, Georgia

- Education and Science

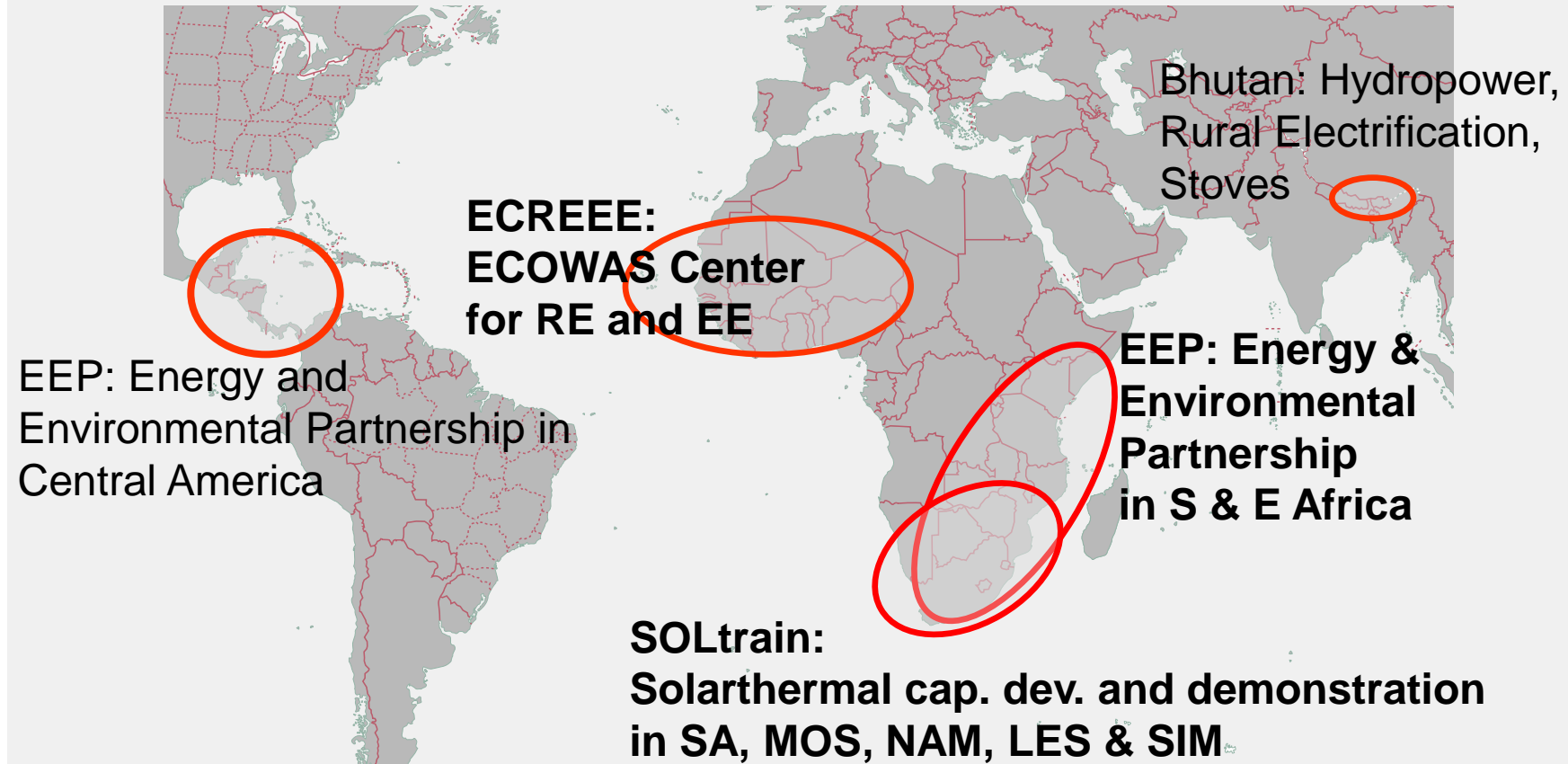


Cross-sectoral themes

Renewable Energy (RE) and Energy Efficiency (EE) programs of ADA



SOLtrain: Solar Thermal program in Southern Africa

- Demonstration systems of solar thermal water:
 - > 110 social institutions as schools, hospitals
 - also in SMEs for production
- Solar Thermal Technology Platforms and Centres of Competence to expedite the transition to RE economy
- Six year program 2009 – 2015 funded by ADA and OFID
- Partners: Universities and regional solar association in 5 countries SA, MOS, NAM, LES, ZIM

EAP: Energy and Environmental Partnership in Southern and Eastern Africa

- Promotes feasibility studies, pilot projects for Renewable energy, Energy efficiency and clean technology investments
- Five Calls for pilot projects and feasibility studies
- 11.5 mill. EUR committed to 79 projects

Three Donors:

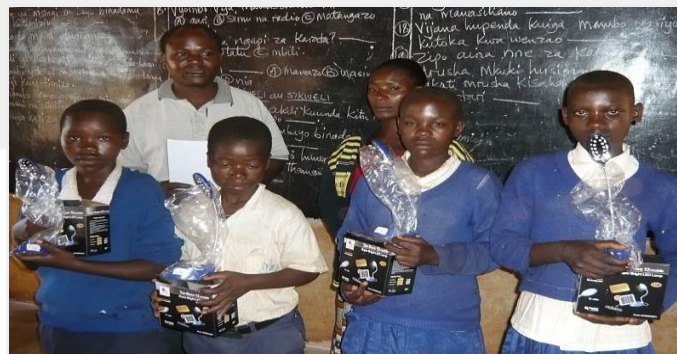
- Ministry for Foreign Affairs of Finland
- Austrian Development Agency
- DFID (since 2012)

Now: 13 partner countries in Southern and Eastern Africa

EEP S&EA, Phase I

Expected results ...

- 94.747 tons carbon dioxide annually not emitted
- improved access to energy for approximately 600.000 people in 110.000 households
- 12 health centres equipped with photovoltaic plants
- approximately 7000 fulltime jobs and
- more than 1000 part time jobs created
 - 50% women
- 6.000 adults und 320 young people trained



EEP S&EA, Phase II



- **Duration: July 2013 to June 2017**
- **Partner: SADC and EAC, 8 MS of SADC and 5 of EAC**
- **Donors: Finland, Austria, UK**
- **Target group, beneficiaries:**
 - enterprises, municipalities, NGOs, universities
 - private and industrial consumers
- **Volumen Euro 35,50 Mio.**
 - ForMin (lead donor) Euro 12.50 Mio., DFID Euro 21.00 Mio.
 - ADA Euro 2.00 Mio.

ECREEE: Regional Programme in West Africa

ECREEE: Initiated by ECOWAS, UNIDO, first bilateral donor Austria

Door opener to the international donor community

- Bilateral: ADA Austria, AECID Spain, Germany, Japan, France etc.
- Multilateral: UNIDO, EU, EUEI PDF, GEF, World Bank, REEEP etc.

Cooperation with and between 15 West African states:

- ECREEE as facilitator for knowledge exchange
- Capacity building for RE, EE, access, policy tools and financing
- Formulation and adoption of policy guidelines and action plans
- Formulation and Acquisition of projects / programs

Replication in the regions SADC and EAC

- Member states of EAC and of SADC recognize need for regional centres for RE and EE and required support to UNIDO
- ADA supports feasibility studies and all necessary workshops with SADC and EAC in 2013
- Austria signed MoU with EAC and UNIDO on 28th of May to support the creation of a centre; ADA contributes 1 Mio €
- EAC energy ministers will probably adopt the concept in June
- Hopefully launch of two new African energy centres in 2013 – 2014

ADA supports Business Partnerships (1)

ADA business partnership programme:

- promotes investment **projects** and
- their **local partners**

Presumptions:

- ✓ Both commercial and developmental impact
- ✓ Maximum project term may not exceed three years
- ✓ Project proposals have to be submitted by an Austrian or EU company

ADA supports Business Partnerships (2)

ADA offers financial support for your projects of

- up to EUR 200,000 (in strategic projects 500,000) counting max. 50% of direct costs
- up to EUR 20,000 counting max. 50% of costs for a feasibility study

In addition, ADA assists you with

- developing your project idea
- brokering contacts

Funding Civil Society

NGO Cooperation International

NGOs are important partners in development cooperation. Through co-financing ADC supports Austrian civil initiatives in development countries.

Conditions for NGO cofinancing:

- Projects and programmes are carried out together with a local implementing partner
- NGOs develop the projects on their own initiative
- NGOs contribute with a percentage of own funds to the project costs



Partnership in Higher Education

- **APPEAR – Austrian Partnership in Higher Education and Research for Development**
- Diplomatic Academy of Vienna (special courses and a limited number of scholarships)
- ITH – Institute of Tourism and Hotel Management
- IPGL – International Post-graduate Training Course in Limnology
